Background Information:	There is the possibility that one or both of the new classroom wings at Heritage High School might be ready in August 2021. Given that possibility, there has been discussion among staff about the opportunity to move WGMS and FSMS 8 th graders under the soon-to-be new high school zones directly to HHS instead of attending MHS for one year and then being moved. According to the Demographer, this is currently 134 students. There are many strengths and challenges to this opportunity. While it is no doubt beneficial to students, there remains a risk the classroom portion of the building would be completely turned over to us by August in addition to other considering factors. Staff will inform the school board to this possibility, review strengths and challenges, and gather input from the board whether this is something to pursue in earnest. A final decision would be required when the revised attendance boundaries are
